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CNC/NCK GENERAL ASSEMBLY - 25 MARCH 2026

On 25 March 2026, the CNC/NCK General Assembly took place in Brussels, bringing together more than 40 members. A notable presence came from the chemical and pharmaceutical sectors, confirming their growing importance within the organisation. The meeting was hosted at the KBC headquarters, providing a professional and welcoming setting.

Chairman Koen Grégoir presented the key strategic topics, based on the conclusions of the November COMNAT seminar. The mission and core values of CNC/NCK were reaffirmed, with a strong emphasis on independence from political parties and other trade unions. Looking ahead to the upcoming social elections, the organisation aims to better reach executives in the public sector, despite current limitations linked to partial recognition.

The growth strategy focuses on visibility and influence. CNC/NCK intends to strengthen its presence on social media and engage with political stakeholders to achieve full recognition. Broadening these contacts was also encouraged as part of a long-term development path.

Financially, the organisation remains solid, with stable expenditure and gradually increasing revenues. A reform of membership fees, aimed at simplification and reduction as of 1 January 2027, was unanimously approved.

Several policy topics were also discussed. A framework on company cars and mobility budgets was presented, highlighting the continued shift towards electrification, while also acknowledging practical challenges. The “Arizona” measures were reviewed, with attention to taxation, pensions, and indexation. CNC/NCK reaffirmed its position that the tax burden on executives should not increase and that wage indexation remains essential. The meeting concluded with a walking dinner, offering participants an opportunity for informal exchange and networking.

This General Assembly once again confirmed CNC/NCK’s ambition to strengthen its role as an independent voice for executives.
